





The Hawkeye Global GrainStalk program was formed to generate significant volumes of rice or wheat and other agricultural commodities and to assist in eradicating poverty with sustainable economic development beginning in Côte d'Ivoire and its regions. The program is designed to provide the ability to produce stalk-based building materials for housing, furnishings and fuel. The building materials are fireproof, thermal and acoustically-sound, and superior in strength to other materials. As a wood replacement material, GranStalk programs will help eradicate deforestation and offers a low carbon footprint while being fully sustainable.

The Ivorian Government's program consists of leasing over one million acres in an effort to achieve the overall objective of reducing poverty and utilizing harvested byproducts in conjunction with additional Hawkeye Global eco-development programs.

Côte d'Ivoire covers 322,463 sq. km, which is slightly larger than the state of New Mexico. The country's soil is rich with nutrients which is ideal for farming. Millions of these acres are undeveloped agricultural land and forest. The President Côte d'Ivoire has developed a strategic plan to bring business back into the country in an effort to stabilize the economy. The former Ambassador of Côte d'Ivoire in the US, his Excellency Daouda Diabate, along with the President and Prime Minister initialed the program to contribute to the success of the country's progress in agriculture, passing the baton to the current administration and President, Alassane Ouattara. Hawkeye Global's GrainStalk program targets this opportunity as a future endeavor with the Ivorian government.
